

In the domain of technology, we introduced the Advanced City Surveillance Grid Protocol, enhancing the precision and reliability of the city's surveillance network. Additionally, the newly established EYES (Empowering Your Everyday Safety) teams were deployed to ensure uninterrupted camera functionality. Together, these measures have greatly strengthened real-time crime prevention and detection.

Beyond core policing responsibilities, the Hyderabad City Police upheld its humanitarian ethos. During Police Martyrs' Commemoration Week, our personnel voluntarily donated 5,000 units of blood, demonstrating our commitment to public welfare and community service.



Sri Rama Navami Festival Bandobust







Mule Accounts

(using your bank account for others)

Giving your bank account, UPI, or credentials to someone for "transactions" is a crime. You may be held legally responsible if your account is used for fraud or money laundering.

Digital Arrests

Scammers impersonate police, CBI, or courier officials and frighten victims by claiming involvement in a crime, then force them to stay on video calls and pay money. Remember: no police, government agency conducts "digital arrests" or demands payments on calls.

Al Fake Fraudesters

Dial 1930 to report

Cybercrime

Deepfake and Al-generated scams fraudsters now use Al to create fake voices or videos of known people asking for money. Always verify through another channel before acting on such requests.

Do not fall prey to high-return offers: If someone promises "quick money" or "guaranteed profits," it's almost always a trap. Legitimate investments never promise unrealistic returns.

Never send money blindly: Fraudsters impersonate friends or relatives and ask for urgent help. Always confirm through a phone call or another independent source before sending money.

Never share OTPs

No bank or authority will ever ask for them. Sharing them even once can let fraudsters take over your accounts.

Betting apps and online gambling traps

Most betting apps operate illegally and capture your personal and financial data. Losses are guaranteed, and your information may be sold to other scam networks.

APK files: Do not install APK files sent through WhatsApp, or unknown websites; most are modified to steal data. Only download apps from official app stores.

Organisations must follow best cybersecurity practices:

Use strong access controls, regular audits, and timely patches to keep systems safe. Employees must be trained to recognise phishing and data-theft attempts.

Illegal loan apps: Many unregulated apps steal contacts, photos, and messages, then harass borrowers. Borrow only from RBI-approved lenders and avoid clicking loan ads shared on social media.







Special Branch




The Special Branch (SB) of the Hyderabad City Police acts as the crucial intelligence and verification arm, primarily responsible for maintaining internal security, public order, and communal harmony.

The Special Branch also undertakes extensive verification work, which includes passport, job and police clearance verifications, threat perception assessments, and issuance of NOCs and press declarations. The Branch has ensured prompt and transparent disposal of all verification requests received from Central and State Government departments, PSUs, and private organisations.

Job Verification

The Verification Section of Special Branch, Hyderabad, is entrusted with the verification of character, antecedents, and certificate genuineness of candidates selected for employment in Central, State and Semi-Government organisations as per the procedures prescribed by the Intelligence Department, Telangana, Hyderabad.

City Armed Reserve



Functionally, the CAR Police is organized into four key groups: General, Special Operations, Security, and Logistics. It serves as the armed reserve for the Hyderabad City Police, providing crucial support for law enforcement and security operations across the city. Sanctioned strength of this unit is 6,448 while the actual strength is 5,002.

- ▶ Providing Force to Guards & Escorts to Union/State Protectees, IAS Officers, IPS Officers, Courts, Government Establishments, Hospitals, Consulate General Offices/Residences etc.,
- ▶ Deploying platoons (Men & Women) daily to zones for various Law and Order bandobust duties.







Hyderabad City Police has launched the Advanced City Surveillance Grid Management Protocol, along with Empowering Your Everyday Safety (EYES), a new multidisciplinary teams created to ensure the city's extensive CCTV network operates with fewer disruptions. A major overhaul of how the city maintains and upgrades its surveillance infrastructure. The new system is intended to handle an ecosystem that now includes more than 16,000 police-owned CCTV cameras, over 50,000 community and private feeds, and upwards of 1 lakh 'Nenu Saitam' community-linked cameras.
